BUSINESS ARISING FROM REPORT

Discussion from previous meeting re Masters State Titles entries for boat crews. Don Alexander felt that the entry criteria for the Masters boats should be looked into. His thoughts that on the day Port Noarlunga used their multiple entries to scratch crews from age groups. Tom Pearce was adamant that this was not the case and that the entries were changed at State centre prior to this event. He presented the meeting with a copy of the email that was sent to State Centre at the time explaining their situation.

AGENDA ITEMS

Newly formed ASRL-QLD seeking our support for the upcoming ASRL AGM to change section 11 of the constitution. The amendment is that the Committee will be comprised of: -

- a) One elected member from each state.
- b) The National President, to be elected by the State Representatives from nominations received.

Moved George Scarfe, that the ASRL-SA supports the Qld motion. Seconded Peter Symons CARRIED

Just a note of interest on this item, ASRL – QLD, ASRL-NSW have now been formed and Incorporated, Victoria are in the process. Tony Park has had preliminary conversations with NT and they are keen to set up as well. It seems that SA has been the benchmark for the other states to follow. They are impressed with our working relationship with SA State Centre and will be endeavouring to follow our example.

Carnival Calendar 2005/2006

Much discussion took place on the proposed calendar for the coming season. Don Alexander explained that it was a very busy schedule and that the extra Super Series events would have to be planned wisely to fit in with this seasons calendar. It was decided to wait until the program was finalised and to discuss it at next months meeting.

Don Alexander spoke on the High Performance squad. Peter Edwards asked re the criteria of selection for the Womens Boat crew in particular. Don looking to have last years State titles placegetters as first entrants in this category, same for all disciplines, but there would be a wild card system for crews that could be put forward by the Boat panel. Discussion re this, decided that a competition prior to the first high performance carnival be considered to select these crews, if the placegetters from last year not available. This event would need to be prior to September 18th.

High performance testing would take place on September 18th for all competitors; the idea was to leave no doubts in the minds of the competitors as to their requirements to represent the State this coming season. A series of competitions will be conducted to trial as near as the Interstate comp as possible.

ASRL-SA Annual Dinner Saturday 23rd July money & numbers required

Some Clubs still to pay for their tickets, time is running out and must have indications confirmed by Monday 18th July so the venue can be notified of same. So far we have 198 confirmed. Tony Park asked that all Clubs try to get their pennants so they can be displayed. Deposit needs to be paid, so we need money from the members intending to go.
