He suggested a "Come and Try" day at West Lakes for those interested. Tony has spoken to Elaine Farmer re SLSSA being involved in some capacity. Tony to follow up. This could incorporate the suggestion of R. Mooney from last meeting re rowing for younger members.

Allen Hodson:

State Titles program. Look at holding rounds and first quarter finals on Saturday. This will create softer cuts and allow the time on Sunday to conduct the necessary races without time constraints. Members of the meeting felt that with due notice this would not present a problem. Item to stay on agenda until resolved, possibly at the AGM. BOSS Chairman agreed that crews should present for as many races as possible to earn the right to contest the State title finals.

Peter Tidswell:

Murray River 100km marathon. To be held on the long weekend in June 10th-12th. Involves rowing 30km a day. Staying at Waikerie. Glenelg are looking at going and have spoken to organisers re rowing a different crew each day. Camping is available at Waikerie, rowing takes place each from Waikerie. Entry is \$90 per competitor. This includes insurance for competitors.

The Life Saver relay will be conducted as the first event at all carnivals this season. The event is Boat, Ski, Board, Swim, Run and the team shall consist of at least one Female and one Under 17 competitor. The number of teams will have to be looked at, as heats will be a problem for this event adding too much time to the day's calendar. Could be conducted on a relegation system. This is another reason to look at boats starting on Saturday at the States because of the likely hood of heats. Allen Hodson queried the lack of SA team at the Aussies, no nominations received.

Tony Park read through a draft boat calendar for next season. Sweeps course to be conducted this year, it will be a re-accreditation course for those existing, code of conduct and safety issues to be looked into with the experienced sweeps.
